## Notice:

### Drainage and Sanitary Sewer Dye Testing

Starting this December, the City of White Rock will begin testing a number of storm sewer systems throughout the City of White Rock in an effort to find areas where rainwater and surface drainage are improperly entering the system. Sanitary sewer systems will also be checked.

Please note that during the testing process, **crews from SFE Global (the City's contractor) may require access to your property** in order to inject dye into toilets and/or into roof or ground-level storm drains. Hoses may also be required to supply water. **Residents are advised that dye used in the tests will not damage or discolour property.**

Dye-testing is non-destructive and provides significant cost savings in sewer operations and maintenance. Perhaps more importantly, it offers an opportunity to lessen the environmental impact of overflows.

Do you live near Maccaud Park (located to the north and south of Kent Street Activity Centre) or Centennial Park?

Please note that the City has contracted a tree trimming company to remove all hazardous limbs/trees in the park.

Although our goal is to keep as many of the trees standing as possible, some whole trees may need to be removed in cases where rot is especially severe.

In the event a tree needs to be removed, please note that two trees will be planted to replace it, and "habitat stumps" kept whenever possible.

It's that time of year again. Courtesy Parking Decals will be available for sale at White Rock City Hall (Development Services) beginning Monday, December 1. The cost will be \$26.50 (\$25.00 plus GST).

Development Services is open Monday to Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

For your convenience, Development Services will also be open Saturday, December 6, from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Garbage Decals and Dog Licences will also be available for purchase.

### To qualify for a Courtesy Parking Decal, you must:

- Be a resident of the City of White Rock
- Produce a valid driver's licence bearing your White Rock address
- Produce your current valid owner's certificate of insurance (ICBC) and vehicle licence showing the same address as your driver's licence.

**Are you a veteran?** Parking is free on the waterfront and at all City of White Rock parking meters for all vehicles bearing Veteran Licence Plates—no courtesy decal required!
